



# **Contracting Activities**



The first agreement of the new calendar year is in place and we are in the evaluation stage of the second. We are in the strategy and planning stages of four others including one new estates area, Building Repairs and Maintenance which takes us to the end of the academic year.

Price increases are coming in across all categories, but particularly goods such as domestics and office supplies. It is always our aim to deliver value and as such to mitigate any increases. We have a robust process in place to challenge the suppliers. We keep abreast of market trends so we know issues with raw materials and we do ask for detailed evidence of the increases from their suppliers. We take some of this information down to line level. We will also have conversations about switching products to get better value alternatives. We also have a detailed process internally where Category Managers are required to produce a Commercial Recommendation Report outlining all the action taken to mitigate the increase, reductions in prices, evidence etc..before a decision is made.



# 3D Printers, 3D Scanners and Associated Equipment Dynamic Purchsing System

NWUPC members can now access the APUC led <u>Dynamic Purchasing System for 3D Printers, 3D Scanners and Associated Equipment</u>. The DPS is open to members of APUC, HEPCW, LUPC, NEUPC, NWUPC and SUPC. This agreement started on the 10th January 2022 and will run for two years with two twelve-month extension periods available.



## What is a Dynamic Purchasing System?

A Dynamic Purchasing System (DPS) is a completely electronic system used by a Contracting Authority (buyer) to purchase commonly used goods, works or services. Unlike a traditional framework, suppliers can apply to join at any time, so please check the up-to-date list of suppliers prior to conducting a call-off. You can invite suppliers to apply to join the DPS through Public Contracts Scotland – Tender under PPQ code PPQ\_5667. A guidance document for prospective suppliers is available in Appendix I. Institutions are encouraged to share this document with suppliers they are encouraging to join this DPS.

### Scope of the DPS:

The scope includes: stereolithography printers, fused deposition modelling printers, selective laser sintering printers, polyJet printers, digital light processing printers, multi-jet fusion printers, direct metal laser sintering printers, electron beam melting printers, structured light scanners, laser scanners, LIDAR and associated accessories, software, and support/servicing.

### This DPS offers the following benefits:

#### How do I call-off?

The DPS operates through a two-stage process, stage one is prequalification to be admitted to the DPS and this is conducted by APUC. Stage two is the award of individual contracts. Call-off is therefore by minicompetition only.

There is a detailed <u>User Guide on HEContracts</u> with information on how to conduct a call-off including suggested tender questions and evaluation criteria available for your use.



## **Addressing and Mitigating Supply Risks Webinar**

UK Universities Purchasing Consortia

On the 25th January NWUPC Members joined Peter Smith MA FCIPS FRSA for the third UKUPC webinar brought to you by NEUPC. The session on 'Addressing and Mitigating Supply Risks in Challenging Times' was a big hit and there were some very interesting and informative points raised by Peter and questions from the audience.



The 90-minute session covered a range of current challenges that many procurement people and functions are facing including:

- Inflation, price, and commercial challenges
- Supply availability and supply chain resilience
- Reputational risk and environmental impact

With the procurement industry seeing more supply disruptions and shortages than we have for decades. Meanwhile, inflation is taking off, which brings challenges to everyone, but particularly for organisations where revenue and budgets are also being squeezed.

The webinar provided practical ideas in terms of managing cost, value and risk, with thoughts on how "procurement with purpose" can be meaningful and positive for any organisation. Peter also covered steps that procurement professionals can take away to help their organisations through these unique times. 
## What do you think are the future opportunities and challenges within the NWUPC Category Groups?

## A fun fact about me that you might not know is...


I was a child model for Littlewoods' catalogue, Gap and often did fashion shows.
